Our Enrolment Scheme Explanation:

There is sometimes confusion in our community about our enrolment scheme, and it causes frequent upset for a family when they are unable to enrol when they live out of zone. The rules around school zones are outlined in government legislation as follows:

The Purpose of the enrolment scheme of a State school is:

- (a) to avoid overcrowding, or the likelihood of overcrowding, at the school; and
- (b) to ensure that the selection of applicants for enrolment at the school is carried out in a fair and transparent manner; and
- (c) to enable the Secretary to make the best use of existing networks of State schools.

In achieving its purpose, the enrolment scheme of every State school must, as far as possible, ensure that —

- (a) the scheme does not exclude local students; and
- (b) no more students are excluded from the school than is necessary to avoid overcrowding at the school.

There are many detailed procedures that must be adhered to by the school and are available on the Ministry of Education website if you wish to read these. You may view our scheme on our website.

Here are the answers to some of the questions parents often ask.

Why have one? Our school has doubled in size over the years, and the board and ministry do not want to keep building more classrooms when there is space available in other local schools. We currently have spaces for about 530 children. Current roll: 485. We try to manage the scheme in such a way to 'not exclude more than is necessary to avoid overcrowding' but also manage this in a way to keep class numbers as low as possible. (currently under 20 in juniors and 26 in seniors) Note too, that the scheme guarantees a place for all families living in our zone at the time of enrolment if they wish to enrol with us. It is not compulsory to do so of course!

Why do we advertise a number of out of zone spaces? Legislation requires us to and we also need to. We 'export' on average, 80 Yr6 graduates to Intermediate each year and we need to replace these each year to maintain the current levels of staffing and resourcing we are fortunate to have. In 2021 there are very few 5 olds living within our enrolment zone. That means we must, by law and by need, advertise and ballot a number of out of zone spaces this year. We regularly review the availability of spaces due to the increasingly transient nature of our community, and we advertise them as they become available over the year.

What about the Lockerbie subdivision? The board of trustees is very aware that the subdivision will impact on all Morrinsville schools and possibly result in a new school over time. We keep in close contact with the developers and the ministry to ensure that the decisions we make regarding our roll, allows for future needs. What we currently know is that there are no children expected from the development this year, and very few next year. We also know that the Ministry of Education is about to review the rolls and accommodation in and around Morrinsville with a view to managing these. We are expecting that our zone may become even smaller, and that fewer out of zone places will become available. We will however, work hard to ensure provision for out of zone siblings is made so that no families are split as things progress in the coming year.

The school works very hard to manage the roll within the law and the accommodation of the school. The ministry recognises how challenging this is to achieve, and are very happy with the open and transparent way we are able to achieve this.


