We were pleased to welcome our refreshed and happy students back to school on Monday after their well-deserved holiday.

### **Health Curriculum**

Over the next three weeks one of our learning focuses will be on Personal Health & Physical Development.

Responses from our Health Curriculum survey in 2021 identified that parents would appreciate communication around what the content of these lessons will include. To acknowledge this, to be responsive to any concerns some may raise, we will send home individual lesson content notices **prior to each lesson** so you will know what is being discussed.

Your child will also be sent home a brief notice after each lesson that will explain what was talked about in class that day. This will help parents unpack the learning at home too.

We appreciate that this content can touch on sensitive topics for some families. We would like to reassure our families that the main focus of these lessons is to help the children become increasingly responsible for their own health and wellbeing with the support and guidance of their trusted family members.

We want to reassure families that we have avoided including any controversial topics, and are not promoting any personal beliefs or agendas. Staff have strategies in place that will refer any children's sensitive or controversial questions to parents if they were to arise. Those parents will receive a personal email regarding what was asked for you to respond to in line with your family context.

If you have any questions about the lesson content we will be sharing prior to delivery, please take to time to talk or phone your child's teacher. They will be very happy to talk with you.

### **Student Reporting is Going Live on Hero Tomorrow**



We have included in this newsletter information around how we report your child's progress and achievement through our Hero App. Take the time to have a look and if you have any questions you can discuss these at the Learning Conversations next week.

### **Reporting Student Progress and Achievement**

The New Zealand Curriculum recognises that learning is like a roller coaster. We all learn at different rates, sometimes the learning clicks, and sometimes it takes a little longer.

At David Street School we recognise this journey. From tomorrow, when you log back into your students' HERO learning portal (link can be found on our website) you will find some dials/graphs representing Reading, Writing and Maths.

These dials indicate the learning and achievement of a child in relation to our David Street School Learner Pathways. The example is a **Year 4 student** who is performing at their **expected level** of schooling.

If you have any questions regarding your child and their learning as a result of these dials there will be time at the learner conversation meetings next week to discuss these.

If you are unable to attend the meeting and want to talk to your child's teacher please get in touch via the teacher's school email.



This shows that the child has some goals from the previous year that they are still completing. Although some may be grey, the reason for this could be that the focus in class is not on that goal.

Often the goals are similar at each year level but have more complexity as the years progress. Teachers will cover the uncompleted goals throughout the year but the focus is on goals at the child's current year level. The Grey shows goals that have not been taught so far this year or may have been taught but are not the current learning focus.

### **Evacuation Procedures**

In light of recent events beyond our school, we have had a few questions and concerns from parents and whānau around *our* evacuation procedures and keeping your children safe at David Street School. This is understandable, and we ourselves are always revising our procedures.

- Firstly, we would like to assure you that we have *sound and practised procedures* in place, and the **safety of your children is** always foremost in our minds. We need to remain calm and orderly. Our processes are in line with those required of all state schools.
- In the case of any incident that requires evacuation, the school is required to be guided by police and emergency services.
- Should a lockdown threat happen, the Police or emergency services will also control our entrances. Although your first instinct may be to collect your child, parents and visitors will not be able to come on site unless invited to do so. There are a few reasons for this; we need to limit the number of people onsite, we need to know where every child is and collection of children needs to be organised and safe, the main entrances have to be clear for emergency services.
- We will continue to keep parents updated with information as it comes to hand, via Hero, email and website.
- We do not wish to keep children at school longer than is necessary. Once we have been cleared to do so, parents/caregivers will be advised of pick-up procedures.

We are currently looking into purchasing a new school App that is more suited to sending out alerts and notices to parents. Evacuation and Lockdown.
